NORTHERN COUNTIES CUP

Format

This competition is open to all Clubs within the Counties of Aberdeen, Banff, Caithness, Inverness, Kincardine, Moray, Nairn, Orkney & Shetland, Ross & Cromarty and Sutherland. The handicaps of team members must be held at the club they are representing. Each club is entitled to send 2 teams (second team will be balloted out if entry exceeds 40).

The winners and runners up from the previous year will be seeded in the draw.

It is a scratch competition and each team will comprise of 4 Gents or Boys and the format will be two 4 ball better ball matches. Each match will be played over 18 holes and to a finish at the 18th (ie holes up) and the holes up of the two matches will be added together. In the event of a tie extra holes will be played. The winning team will progress to the next round until there is an eventual winner. The match is played from the Medal (White) Tees

The winning team will receive the Northern Counties Cup

Conditions

1. Method of Entry



The Secretary of the Northern Counties will send out entry forms and information to all eligible clubs. The club will confirm their intention to participate by returning the entry form with fee.

2. Intention to Play

Teams must arrive at the host club no later than 15 minutes before their scheduled tee time and inform the Northern Counties of their intention to play

3. Transportation

The use of buggies is by medical exemption only and golfers must apply to the Northern Counties for this in advance.

4. Suspension/Abandonment of Play

Play will be abandoned if course deemed unplayable. The competition will then usually be rescheduled at a later date.

5. Distance Measuring Devices

The Northern Counties will comply with the local rule of the host club.

6. Disputes

Any dispute which cannot be resolved by the competitors should be brought to the attention of the secretary of the Northern Counties.

- 7. Open to Gents and Boys who hold a competition handicap.
- **8.** Trophy to be awarded at the prizegiving on the day after the conclusion of play.
